Try the directions from **Rory's Story Cubes** below or use them any way you like. Choose an image to be the starting point of your story. Find a way to use each image until you conclude your story with the 9th cube!

Here are some **short poetry forms** you might like to try. If you decide to do one of these, you may only need to use one or a few of the images. Have fun!

Naani: Four lines with a total of 20 to 25 syllables.

Byte: Use 140 characters or less to write this poem. No other rules.

Tricubes: Three stanzas of three lines with three syllables each for a total of nine lines and 27 syllables.

Acrostic: Write the letters of a word as the first letter of each line of your poem. Each line will be a word starting with that letter.
