

- Either using your senses or your memory, begin filling in the columns with things about your place.
- Note: You can imagine what something tastes like or describe a taste the place reminds you of or leave this one blank! Don't taste anything you don't recognize in nature!
- Look over your words to see which ones best describe your place.
- The first lines of your poem can begin with: I see, I hear, I smell, etc. followed by words from your lists. You can continue with as many lines using your sense words as you like.
- Your last line could simply name your place or tell us something you love about your place.
