
If It Rains Pancakes: Haiku and Lantern Poems by Brian P. Cleary (J 811.54 CLEARY)

Lion of the Sky: Haiku for All Seasons by Laura Purdie Salas (J 811.6 SALAS)




Haiku meet riddles! These poems celebrate the seasons and describe everything from an earthworm to a baseball, and from an apple to snow angels. Ages 5-9.


Out of Wonder: Poems Celebrating Poets by Kwame Alexander (J 808.1 ALEXANDE)
